(NB: By mistake - I used the same email setting as Bassett's earlier email at [9h10](#).

**He was continuing to have a good laugh** as ALL 'my colleagues' KNEW (since [30 Mar 07](#) e.g. **Header 4.5** of my [17.01.08](#) Grievance; **section 3.4** [KPMG pg](#)) that I was 'not allowed' to use the internet.

I will scan the signed form and send it to you. **My usage of the Internet being limited to Webex...**

His [24.04.07-9h10](#) email to me to which Bassett attached a **23 Apr 07** letter issued 'by' [Jeanette Dunworth, HR \(=Bassett\)](#) barring me from using the Internet – except Webex.

I complied with the order by returning the signed letter with my [25.04.07-13h45](#) email to Bassett and Ceri Hughes, my line manager.

In her follow-on email of [25.04.07-15h28](#), **Hughes** replied she 'could not think of other internet-based I might need to access'.

As I reported under e.g. **Header 4.7** of my [17.01.08](#) Grievance, **by Sep 07 they HAD ALSO CUT OFF my access to the WEBEX.COM site** e.g. [26.10.07](#) printscreen when I tried to access the site; and the same taking place on [21.11.07](#).

Under **lines 330-335** of my [17.01.08](#) Grievance, I wrote:

*"While the **24 [1] April 2007** letter I was asked to sign by [Peter Bassett](#) specifically states that I am allowed to access the Webex site (interactive conference calls), **on 21 November 2007** I was unable to join a call (on SharePoint) **[2]** due to being denied*

**access by Websense.** I had been able to join these calls in the past....**Given my current situation, I did not bother reporting it. I see no point doing this.**"

(1) – Error; should be '23' Apr; 24<sup>th</sup> was when Bassett sent it to me to sign i.e. his [24.04.07-9h10](#) email.

(2) – Note at **lines 548-553** of my so-called 'performance appraisal' meeting with [Hughes](#) on [09.10.07](#) (I secretly recorded – recording under **section 8.1 KPMG pg**) that she had emphasised that "**it [was] important [for me] to be [on these calls]**" (**section 8(3)(3) KPMG pg**).

...means that **somebody else needs to deal with the kpmg .com enquiries right away**

In her follow-up email to me of [25.04.07-15h28](#) [Ceri Hughes](#), no doubt getting a high dose of **sadistic kicks from writing it**, wrote: "*this is a good opportunity to remind Jane [colleague] that you aren't able to monitor dot-.com anymore*"

**TRANSLATION:** "a good opportunity to **remind Jane that you are...**

**...a pariah who is no longer allowed to deal with the kpmg.com enquiries...**

**...IN SPITE** of the fact that:

- "*There are a lot of people who say they that they know a lot about our range of services, but they don't.*

*Because of your experience in FAS [1], and then working in RAS [2], you are one of the few people who has that overview of all the service lines" – [Ceri Hughes](#), lines 370-372 during my so-called 'performance appraisal' meeting on [09.10.07](#).*

- The work entailed principally my determining the most appropriate KPMG persons to field the enquiries to (thereby making good use of my knowledge); often providing them with information to help them address them; ensuring that they were followed up promptly.

But, **I liked dealing with the enquiries**, so: **'a good reason to have me taken off!'**

Note that **5 MONTHS LATER**, in her [03.09.07-09h50](#) email to me, **Hughes** wrote:

**"I think you can assume that KPMG internet site is not a forbidden area"**  
**(!!!!!!)**

(1) - FAS = Financial Advisory Services
