This message came up when I tried to get online for an internal conference call.

The same thing had happened before e.g. [26.10.07](#).

As I reported under e.g. **Header 4.7** of my [17.01.08](#) Grievance (**section 11**, [KPMG pg](#)), by **Nov 07 KPMG HAD ALSO CUT OFF my access to this site**. Under **lines 330-335** I wrote:

*“While the **24 [1] April 2007** letter I was asked to sign by [Peter Bassett](#) specifically states that I am allowed to access the Webex site (interactive conference calls), **on 21 November 2007 I was unable to join a call (on SharePoint) [2] due to being denied access by Websense**. I had been able to join these calls in the past.... **Given my current situation, I did not bother reporting it. I see no point doing this.**”*

(1) – Error; should be ‘23’ Apr – the letter ‘from’ Jeanette Dunworth, HR (= Peter Bassett – et.al. in the [Jewish-Freemason ‘Brotherhood\) \(Persecution # 6\)](#) ; 24th was when Bassett sent it to me to sign with his [24.04.07-09h10](#) email. I complied with the order in my [25.04.07-13h45](#) email to Bassett and my line manager, Ceri Hughes (**section 4.2** [KPMG pg](#)).

(2) – Note at **lines 548-553** of my so-called ‘performance appraisal’ meeting with [Hughes](#) on [09.10.07](#) (I secretly recorded; recording under **section 8.1** [KPMG pg](#)) that she had emphasised that **“it [was] important [for me] to be [on these calls]”**.
