Letter from Michael Howard

Dear Resident,

At the next election Britain will face a clear choice.

Under Mr Blair we've had higher taxes but we haven't seen the improvements we all want.

A Conservative Government will cut taxes and give you better value for money.

Could add:

"Police, like Kensington & Chelsea that will side with abusive landlords against you..." (see Police section on the site)

But there's so much more we want to do too.

A Conservative Government will put more police on our streets by recruiting an extra 5,000 police officers each year. This will help restore discipline and respect to our society.

We will get our hospitals clean by giving local infection teams the right to close infected wards without being overruled by managers anxious not to miss government targets.

We will restore discipline to Britain's schools by giving head teachers the power to expel pupils who are being disruptive and stopping others from learning.

And we will control immigration by giving Parliament the power to set an annual limit on the number of people who can settle in Britain. That's what they do in Australia. We should do it here too.

These are our five priorities for government: more police, cleaner hospitals, school discipline, controlled immigration, lower taxes.

But these aren't just another set of promises from a political party. What we promise we will deliver.
